Characteristics

One-semester elective course focusing on <u>topics</u> widely recognized as representative of modern and contemporary drama and theater.

2019 Topic

1969: BECKETT, BRECHT, ALBEE AND THE NEW GENERATION OF BRAZILIAN DRAMATISTS OF THE 1960'S AND 70'S.

Objectives

To introduce elements for the analytical and critical discussion of drama, theater and of the ways through which they represent cultural, philosophical, political and historical forces in different contexts.

Justification

The discussion of drama and of different forms of theatrical figuration is part of a culturally relevant and socially responsible process of formation of literature teachers, researchers and readers.

There are few regularly offered courses in FFLCH focusing on the study of drama and theater. The area of English is one of the few areas to offer its students the possibility of being introduced to the study of drama and theater.

The analytical skills and theoretical references developed in this course will introduce future literature researchers and teachers to the study of drama and theater. These analytical skills can be applied in the study of theater plays in other programs and courses as well.

All of the playwrights in the program are crucially important for the understanding of the formal changes observed in contemporary theater and drama, both in their original contexts and in the contexts of other countries and cultures as well.
