E-contracts

Contracts in electronic forms. These contracts are important to form contracts at large scale.

Types of E-Contracts

There are 3 types of E-contracts:

- 1) Shrink Wrap Contracts;
- 2) Click Wrap Contracts;
- 3) Browse Wrap Contracts.



Shrink Wrap Contracts



Shrink-wrap licenses refer to a license associated with a physical product

The usage of the particular products depends on an acceptance of the terms and conditions of the Contract. In order to be most effective, shrink-wrap licenses need a notice on the outside of the box visible through the shrink-wrap notifying the consumer that the software is copyrighted and the end-user is subject to the terms of agreement within the box. Then within the shrink-wrapped box, the full terms of the license are printed.

A clickwrap contract is mostly found as a part of a software

These agreements are rigid and there is no choice of negotiation in it. Or you agree with the terms and conditions of the contract or you disagree.

Click Wrap Contracts




A Browse Wrap contract is mostly found as a part of a software

Typically, the website's terms of use or service. Browse wrap agreements do not require a user take action to affirm his consent to be bound. Browsewrap terms typically states that the use of the website is deemed acceptance of the agreement.

Browsewrap Agreements

website owner presents evidence that the user had actual manner do not create an enforceable contract unless the Courts have found that terms of use presented in this or constructive knowledge of the terms.



API License Agreement (Clickwrap)

CLICKWRAP AGREEMENT

for a licensor that makes its application programming interface (API) available to developers or other users.

THE TERMS PROVIDED BY THE LICENSOR

Are not negotiated or signed by the Parties.

LICENSEE ACCEPTANCE

By clicking a link or a button.



STANDARD TERMS

For a software owner to license off-the-shelf, unmodified for end use in its licensees'businesses.

EULA

License terms provided by the licensor with software and not meant to be negotiated or signed by the parties.

ACTION

The licensee indicates acceptance by taking a specified action. This EULA is drafted as a clickwrap agreement.

Clickwrap Software End User License Agreement (EULA)

For a mobile app available for download and personal end use on licensees' mobile devices.

The term EULA refers to license terms that are provided by the licensor and are not meant to be negotiated or signed by the parties.



Software License Agreement

<u>Pro-Licensee, Short Form</u>

A short-form agreement for the license of off-the-shelf, unmodified software for the licensee's internal business purposes, drafted with terms favorable to the licensee

Pro-Licensor, Short Form

A short-form agreement for the license of off-the-shelf, unmodified software for the licensee's internal business purposes, drafted with terms favorable to the licensor

Website Terms of Use

Terms and conditions for access to and use of a website, drafted from the website owner's perspective.
