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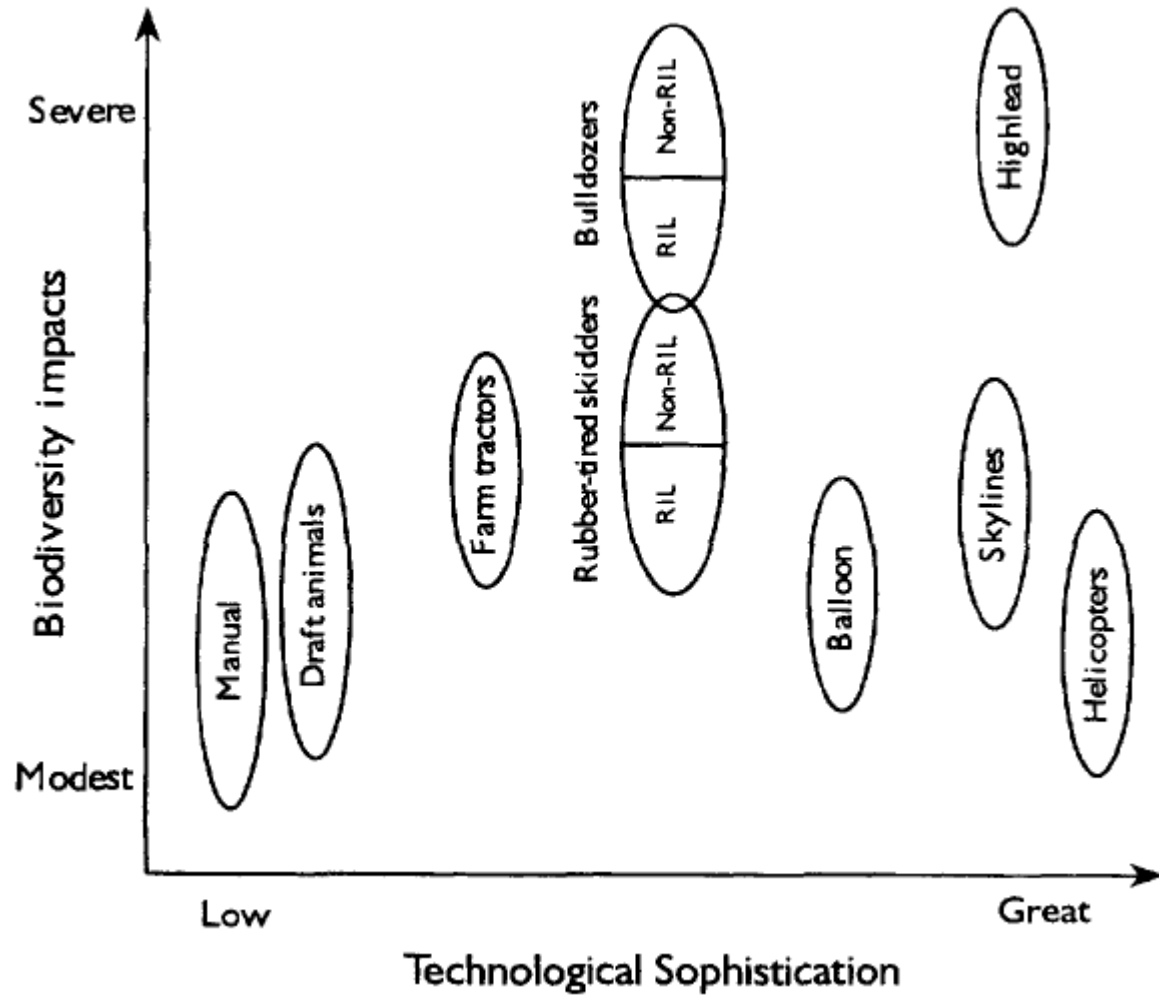


Figure 1 Logging intensities (m^3/ha) for tropical forests. In most of these studies, as in most logging areas in the tropics, felling was with chainsaws and yarding with bulldozers or articulated skidders with rubber tires.

< 1 m^3/ha ——— 50 m^3/ha ——— 100 m^3/ha ——— 150 m^3/ha

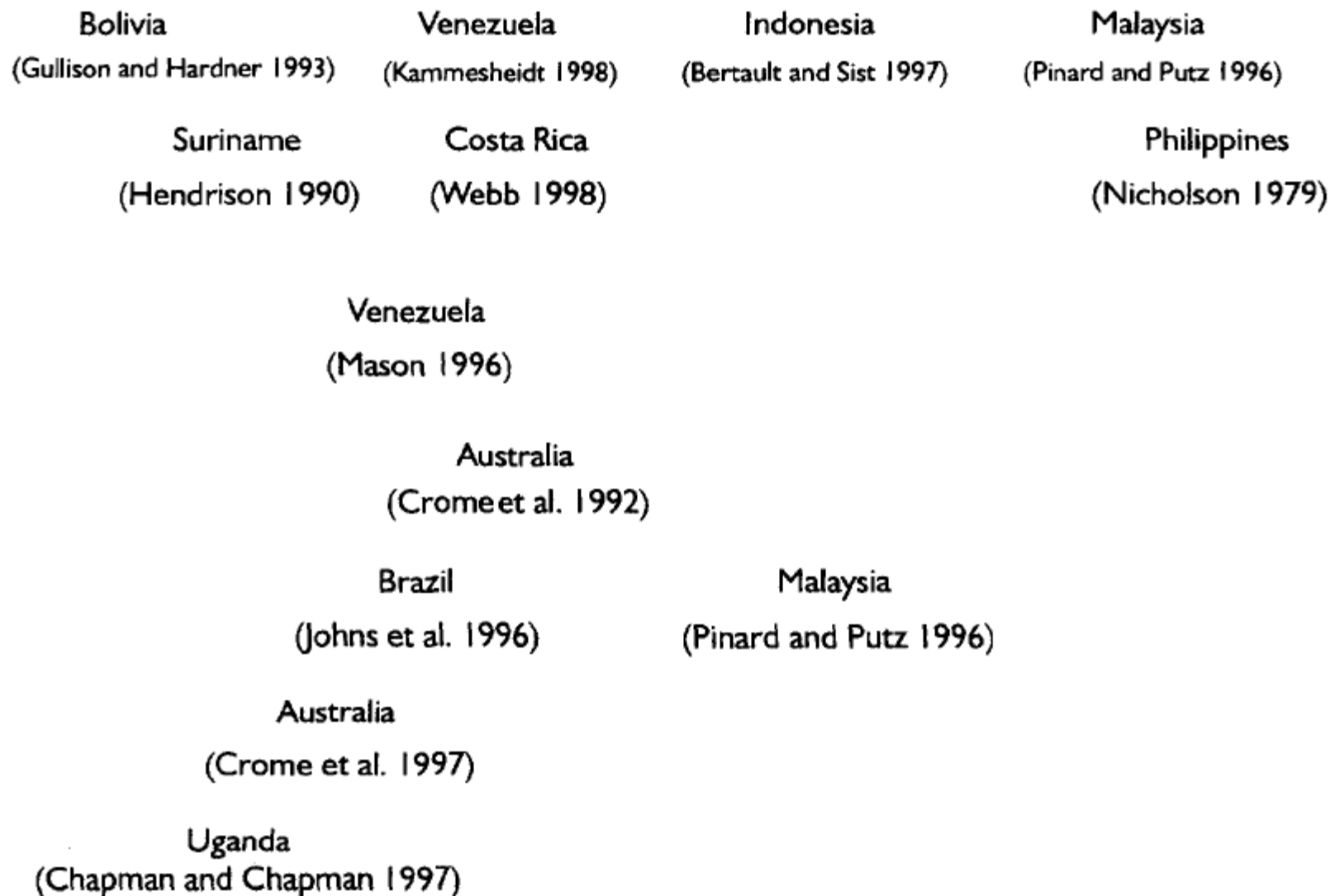


Figure 4 Expected effects of a range of forest uses on the components of biodiversity
