




POSTCOLONIAL LITERARY STUDIES


Post-colonial: History; period after independence.


Postcolonial: consequences of colonialism from the time the area was first colonized. [...] postcolonial studies has introduced not a new period of study, but a new form of criticism or critical strategy which reads texts in the light of the phenomenon of European colonialism since the fifteenth century – so, in that sense, yes, all sorts of texts throughout this period might be read from a postcolonial perspective, whether or not they have their material origins in an explicitly colonial situation [...] postcolonial literary study is concerned with how such writings [from 1930s onwards] have registered and engaged with the experiences of colonialism, decolonisation, and 'postcolonialism' understood not just as a period after colonialism but also as a state of affairs marked by the legacies of colonial rule. 
