The following definitions are all from *The Oxford English Dictionary*.

- A. **chair:** A seat for one person (always implying more or less of comfort and ease); now the common name for the movable four-legged seat with a rest for the back, which constitutes, in many forms of rudeness or elegance, an ordinary article of household furniture, and is also used in gardens or wherever it is usual to sit.
1. **table:** A piece of furniture consisting of a raised flat top of wood, stone, or other solid material, supported on one or more legs, and providing a level surface for working at or on which to place things for various purposes.
2. **computer:** an electronic device (or system of devices) which is used to store, manipulate, and communicate information, perform complex calculations, or control or regulate other devices or machines, and is capable of receiving information (data) and of processing it in accordance with variable procedural instructions (programs or software); esp. a small, self-contained one for individual use in the home or workplace, used esp. for handling text, images, music, and video, accessing and using the Internet, communicating with other people (e.g. by means of email), and playing games.
3. **walk:** to move or travel at a regular and fairly slow pace by lifting and setting down each foot in turn, so that one of the feet is always on the ground.
4. **swim:** To move along in or on water by movements of the limbs or other natural means of progression.
5. **on:** 1) Above and in contact with; at rest on the upper surface of; above and supported by. 2) In contact with, upon the surface of (but not specifically on top of); covering or enclosing (used with reference to clothing, shoes, etc., or any wrapping or cover, such as the cover of a book).
6. **horse:** A solid-hoofed perissodactyl quadruped (*Equus caballus*), having a flowing mane and tail, whose voice is a neigh. It is well known in the domestic state as a beast of burden and draught, and esp. as used for riding upon.
7. **bed:** A permanent structure or arrangement for sleeping on, or for the sake of rest. In some form or other it constitutes a regular article of household furniture in civilized life, as well as part of the equipment of an army or expedition. It consists for the most part of a sack or mattress of sufficient size, stuffed with something soft or springy, raised generally upon a bed-stead or support, and covered with sheets, blankets, etc., for the purpose of warmth. The name is given both to the whole structure in its most elaborate form, and, as in feather-bed, to the stuffed sack or mattress which constitutes its essential part. (A person is said to be in bed, when undressed and covered with the bedclothes.)
8. **red:** Designating the colour of blood, a ruby, a ripe tomato, etc., and appearing in various shades at the longer-wavelength end of the visible spectrum, next to orange and opposite to violet; of or having this colour.
9. **in:** Of place or position in space or anything having material extension: Within the limits or bounds of, within (any place or thing).
within: In the inner part or interior of, inside of, in (a space, region, receptacle, etc.).
10. **ladder:** An appliance made of wood, metal, or rope, usually portable, consisting of a series of bars (rungs) or steps fixed between two supports, by means of which one may ascend to or descend from a height.
